

## Family Biography Project: "The Story of Someone I Love"

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**Due - 13.5.26**

Every family has a hero with an amazing story! Your task is to become a **biographer** (a person who writes about someone else's life). You will choose one member of your family—a grandparent, a parent, an auntie, or even a sibling—and tell their story.

### What to Include

Your biography can be a poster, a booklet, or a digital presentation. Try to include these key sections:

Section	What to look for...
<b>The Basics</b>	Full name, date of birth, and where they were born.
<b>Early Years</b>	What was their school like? What was their favorite toy?
<b>Big Moments</b>	A special job they've had, a place they traveled to, or a proud moment.
<b>Fun Facts</b>	What is their favorite food? Do they have a secret talent?
<b>A Portrait</b>	A drawing or a photograph of your family member.

### How to Get the Information

To be a great biographer, you need to be a reporter! Try asking your chosen person these **three "Golden Questions"**:

1. "What is your earliest memory from when you were my age?"
2. "What is the bravest thing you have ever done?"
3. "If you could go back in time, what advice would you give your younger self?"

### **Additional tasks to uplevel your Biography**

- **Use Photos:** If you have permission, stick in some old photos. It's amazing to see how people have changed!
- **Be Creative:** You can draw a timeline of their life using a long piece of paper.
- **Handwriting:** Try your very best "neatest" writing so we can display these in the classroom.
